An alchemy of ecopoetic story-telling and read-poetry for all ages on the theme of Nature, Environment and Conservation. Two marquees, and more, with established literary artists, offering environmental poetry and prose, barddoniath Cymraeg, and open-air 'cinema', in English and Welsh. environmental poets. In addition there will be wandering poets, creative writing workshops, instrumental music, the Wildlife Art Exhibition, and children's activities. Visitors will be encouraged and helped with Haiku and Englyn writing, in English or Cymraeg, linking our cultures, and tying-in with Conwy's twin-town, Himeji. These Haiku/ Englynion will form the basis for Pensychnant's exhibit in St Mary's Christmas Tree Festival in December


