WILDLIFE RECORDING 2025

"In the end, we will conserve only what we love. We will love only what we understand. We will understand only what we are taught"

At Pensychnant, we propose to make 2025 a year of biodiversity recording in the belief that we cannot conserve that which we do not understand. Not that we haven't been recording wildlife up till now. Cofnod (North Wales Environmental Information Service) tells us that Pensychnant has 29,916 records of 1,719 species, from algae to a Red Squirrel last seen in 1967. Pensychnant is one of the best recorded sites in North Wales. However, for certain, there are many, many

species which we could add. Please help. We have started a new Facebook Group, 'Facebook/Pensychnant's Wildlife', for you to share your sightings; or you can add them to www.cofnod.org.uk; or, better still tell us in person when you visit.

Saturday 8th March, 2-5pm **BUTTERFLY TRANSECT WALKS AND MONITORING SCHEMES By VIC HITCHINGS**

In 2025 Pensychnant aims to do more wildlife recording, and to encourage you do so. At a time when three quarters of our butterfly species are declining, butterflies seem a good subject to start with - everyone likes butterflies. And now is the time to learn, before the butterfly season starts in April. Transect walks form the core of the U.K. Butterfly Monitoring Scheme with more than a thousand now recorded annually. Experienced butterfly expert, Vic Hitchings will discuss butterfly transects and two other survey systems, the Wider Countryside Survey and Reduced Effort Surveys used to methodically record butterflies. We will discuss transect methods, their purposes and uses, data input, and look at 10 years results from Vic's transect Mynydd Marian. £20 including tea/coffee & cake (concessions available). In this course Vic will look at how to identify the butterflies of North Wales. Whilst their visual appearance is the prime identification method, successful

identification is best achieved by using a variety of data sources, including flight periods, flight patterns and geographic distributions. North Wales has 33 resident butterfly species and 3 common migrants. Two other recently recorded species will also be included. It is suitable for beginners to those more familiar with North Wales butterflies.
